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INTRODUCTION

This is a companion book to “Ten Great Teachings from the Bible.” There are things you cannot learn well from looking in a text book. They are best learned by exploring. That is what this book is for.

This is a book of exercises. What does that mean?

Exercises are for building your skills and abilities. These 77 exercises have been planned to build specific skills and abilities. As you do the exercises you will be doing a lot of looking through the Bible, finding your way around and discovering answers. You will also do a lot of looking through and exploring the Small Catechism. I want you to be very familiar with both of those books.

These exercises also introduce and reinforce certain patterns of thinking. As we see patterns in the Bible, in history and in life, there are powerful lessons that stay with us and guide our lives.

It is in the nature of exercises to push the abilities of the athlete or student or disciple. We struggle with some things; but we find out after a period of training that our strength has increased and we are able to do a lot that we could not have done before. There are parts of these exercises that will push you. Some things are easy enough to do on your own. With some things you will be encouraged to work together or have parents help you. That is part of the plan. (It also leads you to talking about the Christian faith between generations.) Some of the exercises will only be finished when we come back together and do them in class. That is also part of the plan.

Other exercises involve doing acts of worship and service. The Christian faith is not simply a block of knowledge or a set of facts. It is worship, and it is life. That is because our faith is a relationship with our God and Savior. We must worship. And our faith involves us in relationships with our fellow believers and with others, who need but do not know God. God sends us into the world so we may live our lives confessing our faith and serving our neighbor in his time of need.

Books you will need are:

“Ten Great Teachings from the Bible.” That is the companion textbook.

“Luther’s Small Catechism: with Explanation” (English Standard Version) from Concordia Publishing House. We use the numbering of questions and of verses; and there are fill-in-the-blank questions. Without that book they will not make any sense. So you will be making heavy use of the Small Catechism.

“The Holy Bible: English Standard Version.” Since that is the version we use in our hymnals that is the version this book uses.

There are other resources that will be made available for specific exercises.
